Aitch, Cue, Eye, Kew, Owe and Yew are all identical in pronunciation to a different letter
 IOU can be made in two different ways to mean “I” or “E O Y” (“IOU” “EYE OWE YOU”)

Mnemonic and Pneumonic differ only in the first syllable

Jot and Zsolt are both pronounced identically

Bound, Found and Pound differ only in the first syllable

Naught, Sought, Thought and Wrought differ only in the first syllable. Sought and Thought are particularly similar. Sought should be hard for native Spanish speakers. Thought should be hard for francophones.

Djinn and Gin are both pronounced identically

Lb (“POUND”) has no memorable connection to “L”
